Background:

The Crowley Police Department presents the FY 2026-27 Annual Budget for review and consideration by the Crime Control and Prevention District Board.

Recommendation:

Set the date for a Public Hearing to discuss and approve the final budget for June 4, 2026 at 6:00 pm at Crowley City Hall.

Financial Information:

The proposed revenues for the 2026-27 year are projected to be \$1,701,653. The upcoming bond payments total \$190,950. The proposed recurring expenditures are projected to be \$788,819.

One-time costs for equipment and other fees are estimated at \$161,478. Total expenditures are estimated to be \$1,141,247. This will leave a surplus of \$560,406.

SERVICE GOALS SUPPORT:

The Crowley Police Department's Criminal Investigation Division is requesting the purchase of three Apple iPads to be issued to each detective. Detectives are frequently contacted by outside agencies outside of normal business hours to provide or deconflict investigative information. Currently, if the requested information is not immediately available, detectives must contact dispatch or on-duty personnel to retrieve it, resulting in delays and the potential for miscommunication or inaccurate information being relayed.

Issuing department-approved tablets will allow detectives to remotely access their desktop systems and securely retrieve case and master file information in real time. This capability will improve response times, enhance accuracy, and reduce reliance on intermediary personnel.

In addition, these devices will support field operations by enabling detectives to access necessary information directly while conducting investigations. This will reduce radio traffic and limit the need to contact other personnel for routine information requests.

Apple devices are CJIS-compliant and meet all current security requirements.

SERVICE GOALS SUPPORT:

The use of unmanned aerial systems (UAS) in law enforcement has grown significantly nationwide. Skydio Axon Drone as First Responder (DFR) programs allow agencies to deploy drones rapidly to calls for service. These systems provide live video to responding units and command staff, enabling better-informed decision-making and safer, more efficient responses.

The Police Department currently does not operate a drone program and relies solely on officer response and other agency drone support. The Axon Air DFR system integrates seamlessly with the department's existing Axon ecosystem, creating a unified platform for digital evidence management. Key purposes and capabilities include:

- Enhanced Situational Awareness: Using Skydio X10 drones, the system delivers high-quality video for monitoring incidents in real-time, even at night with thermal imaging and in complex, GPS-denied environments.
- Improved Officer Safety: Drones can be used to assess dangerous situations, tracking and locating fleeing suspects, critical incidents, and locating missing persons.
- Autonomous Operation: Built on AI-powered, American-made technology, Skydio drones can navigate complex environments with minimal operator workload, with capabilities like tracking subjects and flying through, over, or under obstacles. The DJI Avata 2 excels at Building & Room Clearing by acting as a remote "point man." Officers can deploy the drone into structures to scout hallways, dark corners, and multi-level rooms before officers cross the threshold. This provides real-time video intelligence, allowing officers to identify threats, locate occupants, and map layouts from a safe distance. FARO Zone 3D provides law enforcement with a comprehensive, scientifically validated platform for scene reconstruction, offering specialized tools for forensic analysis and the creation of immersive courtroom presentations. Paired with Skydio 3D Scan leverages AI-powered autonomous flight to automate the complex data capture required for high-fidelity 3D modeling, specifically benefiting crash and crime scene reconstruction.

This is a five (5) year contract with Axon with a total cost of \$129,931.00
